### Aquatic Therapy in Canine Rehabilitation (2 days)

This course introduces participants to aquatics and hydrotherapy and their use in canine rehabilitation and conditioning. Creating a hydrotherapy program including specific exercises is a primary focus. Hydrotherapy equipment and products are covered including selection, use and maintenance.

**Prerequisites:** This course is open to Veterinarians, Veterinary Technicians, Physical Therapists, Physical Therapist Assistants, and Occupational Therapists who have successfully completed Introduction to Canine Rehabilitation.

### The Business of Canine Rehabilitation (2 days)

This course helps participants identify and achieve their business goals in canine rehabilitative medicine. Hiring, firing, purchasing, and salary negotiating are explored through extensive role-playing. Participants work together building a model practice from layout and construction, to making day-to-day business decisions and marketing. Group discussions promote collaboration and the sharing of ideas across professions.

**Prerequisites:** This course is open to care providers and practice managers interested in the business aspects of canine rehabilitation.

### Canine Sports Medicine (3 days)

This course covers canine anatomy and locomotion and how they relate to performance. Sports injuries in canine athletes are covered including their causes, prevention and rehabilitation. Participants are introduced to canine sporting events and the organizations that oversee them.

**Prerequisites:** This course is open to Veterinarians and Veterinary Technicians who accompany them. Physical Therapists, Physical Therapist Assistants, and Occupational Therapists who have successfully completed Introduction to Canine Rehabilitation may also attend.

### Nutrition in Canine Rehabilitation (2 days)

This course explores the role nutritional management plays in canine rehabilitation. The formulation of dietary plans and the evaluation of nutrition products are discussed. A case-based approach encourages collaboration as participants make nutritional assessments and recommendations.

**Prerequisites:** None.

### PennHIP Certification (1 day)

This course focuses on canine hip dysplasia and the science that supports the PennHIP radiographic procedure. Participants get hands-on experience using bone and mechanical models as they learn to use the specialized distraction device. Veterinarians certified by PennHIP are eligible to submit radiographs for official analysis.

**Prerequisites:** This course is open to Veterinarians and Veterinary Technicians who accompany them.

### Splinting and Bracing in Canine Rehabilitation (2 days)

This course explains how immobilization, support, protection and assistance devices are used in canine rehabilitation. Biomechanical and fitting principles are covered in depth. Participants get hands-on experience as they formulate custom splints for use on both fellow classmates and canine patients.

**Prerequisites:** This course is open to Veterinarians, Physical Therapists, Veterinary Technicians, Physical Therapist Assistants, and Occupational Therapists who have successfully completed Introduction to Canine Rehabilitation.
